

**2024 Federal Appropriations Update** April 8, 2024 By David McBryde and Jon Weishaar

Last month, the House and Senate wrapped up the federal appropriations process. We now have full fiscal year funding through September 30, 2024. As reported, the final agreement resulted in negotiators increasing the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) by \$1 billion. The additional WIC funding resulted in decreases for many USDA funded programs.

However, for the Farm Service Agency (FSA), bill language separated the funding level for County Offices (CO). This decision protected CO funding from the larger FSA mission area and from reductions. In general, our advocates helped FY 2024 CO funding remain equal to FY 2023 CO funding levels. The following chart highlights specific funding by function.

We are actively working with FSA leadership to determine their direction regarding funding County Office incentive pay initiatives. For now, we can report continuing incentive pay for employees is a priority for USDA's leadership. We continue to monitor this for membership.

In a surprise announcement, Chairwoman Kay Granger (R-TX) announced she would step down as chair of the House Appropriations Committee. We expect the House Steering Committee will formally select Representative Tom Cole (R-OK) as chair of the Committee.

Finally on March 21, the House Agriculture Subcommittee held a hearing with Secretary Vilsack. This hearing included significant discussion about FSA field offices and the need for additional staff. We are thankful to Congressman Scott Franklin's (R-FL) work raising the importance of customer service and the need for additional CO employees. We expect the Senate Appropriations Committee will quickly schedule Secretary Vilsack for his annual budget hearing. **THANK YOU** all for your work helping educate legislators about the
