Legislatively H.R. 82 Social Security Fairness Act which repeals both The Windfall Elimination Provision and the Government Pension Offset now has 175 co-sponsors 128 D and 47 R. You can easily see who has cosigned by googling H.R. 82 then click on the co-sponsor link. Select all for all cosigners or select by democrat or republican if your representatives have not cosigned contact them and ask that they do so. For a discharge petition, it needs 218 co-signers. A discharge petition is a petition to get a bill that has been refused to be brought forward to a vote by the majority, to the floor, for a vote. The Senate has a companion bill S 1302 now with 31 co-signers 25 D, 4 R and 2 I.

H.R. 304 Equal Cola Act a bill to allow FERS employees to receive the same COLA as other retirement Colas when COLA exceeds 2 percent has gained a few co-sponsors and now sits at 20; 17D and 3R.

## **UNAPPROVED MINUTES 2019 NATIONAL CONVENTION**

RASCOE MEETING  
AUGUST 1, 2019  
FLINT HILLS DISCOVERY CENTER  
BLUE EARTH ROOM

The meeting was called to order by President Chad Hart. Cindy Hall provided an invocation and we all introduced ourselves telling our names, where we were from and how many years we've been a RASCOE member.

Roll call resulted in 41 members and 11 associates for a total of 52.

President Hart called for a reading of the minutes. Larry Olsen from South Dakota moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes as they were in the annual report as well as the spring newsletter. The motion to waive the reading was seconded by Larry Eubanks of Texas. Motion carried.

Chad Hart gave the president's report, highlighting that RASCOE had a presence at all of the area rallies. A copy of his written report is in the annual report.

Chuck Land gave the vice-president's report. In addition to the written report, Chuck talked about our efforts in trying to get RASCOE recognized as an organization that would allow for dues check-off through our annuity payments. He asked for a show of hands of those interested in us pursuing this avenue. There were quite a few people that were interested, so Chuck will keep working on it.

Chad read the Secretary's report and expressed Micki's regret that she could not be at the meeting, but we all understood that family always comes first.

Cindy read the publicity report, highlighting Micki's question for the members about the amount and type of information in the newsletters. Mary Johnson from South Dakota challenged the members there to send personal stories to Micki for inclusion.

Gene Vognild from South Dakota asked Chuck if there had been any movement on allowing retirees to pay their health insurance pre-tax. Larry Olsen from South Dakota asked a general question if David Senter had determined if this was an administrative or legislative issue. No one had a definitive answer.

Cindy Hall, then gave the treasurer's report. The treasury is about \$1,000 less this year than last year. We have one state that normally sends in dues that we did not hear from in FY18-19 that would equal about that same amount, so we have basically had income equal to our expenses.

Cindy gave the membership report and announced that Nebraska had won the award for the greatest increase in membership, with a 242% increase. Following the membership report, some members noticed that the membership report in the annual report was inconsistent with what they knew about the membership in their states. Cindy pulled up the correct report in the computer and told the members the correct numbers for all the states. Cindy will ask Micki to print the correct report in the next newsletter. Recent members were asked if they are receiving RASCOE membership information in -their retirement packets. Texas and Colorado both reported that they are not. Cindy will follow up with those states and ask that they start providing this information as RASCOE has been recognized as an organization by 22-PM.

Mary Behm gave the benefits update. She discussed the \$600 Medicare reimbursement available to Blue Cross Basic members who are also Medicare eligible. There was a question as to why it only applied to Blue Cross Basic and not Standard. Mary had asked the question but was not given any answers. Cindy Mengenhauser said she had talked to representatives at the Blue Cross booth and they told her that it was just a pilot program and Basic was what they chose to be in the program.

Lynda Steichen from South Dakota asked if we can still get the Verizon Discount. Mary had talked to them and was told absolutely not. Ben Bosshart from Wisconsin had also checked, and he was told that there are regulations in place that state that discounts are only for active federal employees unless the regulations are changed.

Becky Zirpel from South Dakota related her experience after her phone account with Verizon got hacked. Joan Senter suggested that we investigate Amazon Smile as a means to add a little income for RASCOE. There is no cost to members, but they can do their regular shopping through Amazon and RASCOE would be given a small income from it. Mary will look into it.

Mary also offered a list of discounts for "senior citizens" that she had researched.

Mary Behm gave the webmaster report and indicated that we had been getting quite a few hits on the website. She would like to have members send her pictures of RASCOE meetings and/or RASCOE members activities to add to the website.

The audit committee for 2019-20 was appointed. Brenda Boomer from Texas will be the carry-over member and Shelly Odenkirk from Ohio will be the new member.

Chad introduced an amendment to the constitution and by-laws. The suggestion was made that any member in good standing that attains the age of 90 would be given free lifetime membership. This was based on a letter from a 100-year-old member who was no longer able to pay dues.

We reviewed Page 27, Article 2, Section 1 of the Annual Report. There was discussion on what was meant by 10% of the regular dues paying members. It was suggested to strike the 2nd statement of that paragraph. Lynda Steichen from South Dakota mentioned that when the constitution and by-laws were written they were based on NASCOE's rules. Bob McGrath from Nebraska suggested that all of the constitution and by-laws be reviewed by a committee and presented for amendment next year.

Deb Krusemark from Iowa asked if we have any way of knowing who the retirees in the state are so we know if we have a 50% membership or not. It varies from state to state. Some have lists and some don't. Jim Iverson from South Dakota stated that we need to know exactly what changes need to be made and provide information to the membership prior to the next convention. It was suggested that a committee

be appointed to review the constitution as a whole and make suggestions for change prior to the next annual meeting.

Thanks were offered to Brenda Boomer, Sandy Campbell, Chuck Land and Mary Behm for setting up the hospitality room for RASCOE Members.

There was discussion on how people become honorary life members for NASCOE.

The group approved a \$100 donation to the NASCOE Scholarship fund in the name of Leo Osborne, past NASCOE Secretary Treasurer and past RASCOE Secretary Treasurer.

Next were candidacy announcements. The following indicated willingness to serve for FY 19-20:

We were dismissed at 2:38 p.m. to reconvene on August 2 at 1:00 p.m.

#### **FRIDAY, AUGUST 2, 2019. BLUE EARCH ROOM, FLINT HILLS DISCOVERY CENTER, MANHATTAN, KS.**

The second day of the 25th annual RASCOE meeting was called to order at 12:57 pm by Vice-President Chuck Land.

Roll call resulted in 45 members.

Larry Olsen, South Dakota made a motion to move the discussion of the benefits agreement to Executive Session. Gene Vognild seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Larry Olsen, South Dakota made a motion approve the President's Report. It was seconded by Mary Johnson of South Dakota. Motion carried.

Jim Iverson, South Dakota made a motion to approve all officer's reports. Myron Stroup seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Chuck Land gave the Audit Committee Report. Greg Chewakin, Nebraska made a motion to approve the report. Deb Krusemark, Iowa seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There were no requests to amend the executive policies or travel policies.

Gene Vognild, South Dakota made a motion to amend the by-laws and add Section 5 to read:

RASCOE WILL WAIVE DUES FOR ANY CURRENT RASCOE MEMBER REACHING 90 YEARS OF AGE.

Bob McGrath seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Ben Bosshart, Wisconsin made a motion to approve the following amendment to the constitution.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP SECTION 1

Second sentence to be deleted.

Tim Gray, Oregon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Bob McGrath, Nebraska made a motion to form a committee of no more than 3 people to be appointed by and under the direction of the President and Vice-President to review the constitution and by-laws in full. Cindy Mengershauser, South Dakota seconded the motion. Motion carried. The committee appointed is Bob McGrath, Nebraska, Larry Olsen, South Dakota and Cindy Hall, Nebraska.

Jim Iverson, South Dakota thanked all who prepared the food for the hospitality room, especially Brenda Boomer and Sandy Campbell.

Jim Iverson, South Dakota nominated Cindy Hall for the Office of Treasurer. Brenda Boomer, Texas seconded the nomination. Larry Olsen, South Dakota made a motion that nominations cease, and Cindy Hall be elected by acclamation. Bob McGrath, Nebraska seconded the motion. Motion carried. Cindy Hall was elected as Treasurer.

Mary Johnson, South Dakota nominated Micki Linehan for the Office of Secretary. Tim Gray, Oregon seconded the motion. There being no other nominations, Micki was elected unanimously.

Brenda Boomer, Texas, nominated Chuck Land for the Office of Vice-President. Deb Krusemark, Iowa, seconded the nomination. There being no other nominations, Chuck was elected unanimously.

Cindy Hall, Nebraska, nominated Chad Hart for the Office of President. Paul Newton, Illinois, seconded the nomination. There being no other nominations, Chad was elected unanimously.

The general session was exited, and executive session was opened at 1:20 p.m.

General session was reconvened at 1:50 p.m.

The Spirit of RASCOE Award was presented to Jim Iverson from South Dakota. Jim had been nominated by Gene Vognild and other members of the South Dakota Association. The award was well deserved. Next year's Spirit Award Committee will be Ben Bosshart and Mary Johnson.

We returned to Executive Session at 1:54 p.m.

General session was reconvened at 2:03 p.m.

Dennis Ray, current NASCOE President addressed the group and stated that he would be a full-fledged member in the not too distant future. Vice President Brandon Wilson was also in attendance, but he did not have anything to add.

The general session was exited, and executive session was rec-convened at 2:12 p.m.

The general session was reconvened at 2:16 p.m.

David Senter, KSC Strategies then talked to the committee. He discussed HR 3934, which is a WEP elimination bill.

HR 141 was discussed next. Proposal would be a partial repeal which would pay retirees \$100 per month, spouses \$50 per month and each eligible child \$50 per month. David was asked to gather RASCOE support for HR 141.

David stated that there is no serious effort underway to allow retirees to have pre-tax health insurance premiums. Ben Bosshart, Wisconsin asked whether this is an administration issue or a legislative issue. David explained that it is an IRS regulation that would need to be changed by legislation.

Proposals that would hurt retirees were:

6% more towards retirement

Eliminate all COLA's

High 5 instead of High 3

David felt RASCOE had some victories because none of the above made it to the final bill.

John Lohr talked a little bit about some things that affect retirees.

Dillard's then gave away two \$25 Visa Cards to commemorate RASCOE's 25th anniversary.

Larry Eubank, from Texas, a Dillard's rep donated \$50 as a giveaway also since he received his first year of RASCOE dues free.

Chad Hart, President had a message from Benefits Direct. There was discussion regarding how to send in the wellness benefit claim. Becky Zirpel, South Dakota has been working with Trevor Gartner and will ask him for further clarification.

Chad reappointed the following committee chairs:

Cindy Hall, Membership

Micki Linehan, Publicity

Chuck Land, Legislative

Mary Behm, Benefits and Webmaster

We viewed the memorial presentation honoring members who have passed.

Lynda Steichen made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Barry Allen from Kentucky seconded the motion. The 25th annual meeting of the RASCOE Organization adjourned at 3:09 p.m.

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## Proposed By-Law/Constitution Changes Listed in RED Below

PAGE 1

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1

ANY MEMBER OF THE STATE ORGANIZATION WHICH IS AFFILIATED WITH THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION SHALL BE A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL ORGANIZATION. A STATE CANNOT BE AN AFFILIATE OF RASCOE AND BE AFFORDED ALL RIGHTS, PRIVILEGES, ETC OF A STATE4 AFFILIATE UNLESS THE STATE HAS EITHER 10% REGULAR DUES PAYING MEMBERS OR FIFTY PERCENT (50%) OF THE STATES ELIGIBLE RETIREES AS MEMBERS. NO STATE IS ELIGIBLE FOR AFFILIATION WITH RASCOE UNLESS ARE RASCOE DUES COLLECTED WITHIN THE STATE ARE TRANSMITTED TO THE RASCOE TREASURER. STATES TO BE RECOGNIZED FOR MEMBERSHIP IN RASCOE ARE SHOWN IN EXHIBIT 1, ATTACHED TO THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS.

REASONING:

IT IS VERY DIFFICULT, IF NOT IMPOSSIBLE TO KNOW HOW MANY RETIREES ARE IN A STATE TO DETERMINE THE 10% REQUIRED.

PAGE 2

ARTICLE III - GOVERNMENT

SECTION 1

THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE ASSOCIATION SHALL BE VESTED IN A BOARD OF DIRECTORS COMPOSED OF THE REGULAR DUES PAYING MEMBERS IN ATTENDANCE AT THE ANNUAL MEETING AND SHALL SERVE IN THE MANNER PROVIDED IN THE BY-LAWS. EACH REGULAR MEMBER IN ATTENDANCE AT THE ANNUAL MEETING SHALL HAVE ONE VOTE PROVIDED THEY ARE PRESENT WHEN THE VOTE IS TAKEN, ON ALL MATTERS PRESENTED FOR ACTION AT THE MEETING. THE DIRECTORS SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GENERAL MANAGEMENT OF THE ORGANIZATION AS STATED IN THE BY-LAWS.

REPLACE DIRECTORS WITH EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

SECTION 4. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE SHALL BE THE EXECUTIVE ARM OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS. IT SHALL CONSIDER EACH PRECEDING ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD TO SEE THAT SUCH ACTION IS CARRIED OUT.

(REDUNDANCY)

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - DUES

SECTION 2. ANY STATE AFFILIATE FAILING TO SUBMIT DUES COLLECTED TO THE RASCOE TREASURER BY THE END OF THE FISCAL YEAR (JUNE 30) IS AUTOMATICALLY SUSPENDED. THE INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS OF A SUSPENDED STATE SHALL CEASE TO BE MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL ORGANIZATION (\*). ANY SUSPENDED STATE SHALL AUTOMATICALLY BE REINSTATED ALONG WITH ITS INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS WHEN DUES ARE SUBMITTED.

\* INSERT "UNTIL DUES ARE SUBMITTED TO THE NATIONAL TREASURER"

SECTION 3. ANY INTERESTED PERSON, BUSINESS OR ORGANIZATION MAY BECOME AN ASSOCIATE MEMBER OF RASCOE BY SUBMITTING DUES TO THE TREASURER. ASSOCIATE MEMBERS MAY NOT VOTE, HOLD OFFICE OR BE A MEMBER OF A COMMITTEE OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION. ASSOCIATE MEMBERS MAY PARTICIPATE IN STATE ASSOCIATION ACTIVITY EXCLUDING THOSE MATTERS WHICH HAVE A DIRECT OR INDIRECT BEARING ON NATIONAL RASCOE POLICY, IF A REGULAR DUES PAYING MEMBER DIES, THE SPOUSE MAY CONTINUE BENEFITS BY PAYING ASSOCIATE DUES.

NOT NECESSARY

SECTION 5 ANY DUES PAYING MEMBER WHO REACHES THE AGE OF 90 AND HAS PAID DUES SINCE RETIREMENT WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR FREE LIFETIME RASCOE MEMBERSHIP UPON NOTIFICATION TO THE NATIONAL MEMBERSHIP CHAIR

(TO BE ADDED)

ARTICLE V

SECTION 4

THE TREASURER SHALL RECEIVE DUES FROM ALL OF THE STATE AFFILIATES AND MEMBERS IN NON-AFFILIATED STATES. HE/SHE SHALL COLLECT AND DISBURSE ALL MONIES SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. ALL FUNDS SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN AN ACCREDITED FINANCIAL INSTITUTION IN THE CITY OF RESIDENCE OF THE TREASURER OR OTHER ACCREDITED DEPOSITORIES SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. HE/SHE SHALL BE BONDED BY AN ACCREDITED BONDING FIRM.

SECTION 5

ALL DISBURSEMENTS OF THE ASSOCIATION SHALL BE MADE BY CHECKS OR DEBIT CARD SIGNED BY THE TREASURER (ADD) OR SECRETARY AND SHALL BE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

SECTION 1 THE STANDING COMMITTEES OF THE ASSOCIATION SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. THE COMMITTEES OF RASCOE SHALL PERFORM DUTIES AS PRESCRIBED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND/OR THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE TO FULFILL THE OBJECTIVES AND PURPOSE OF THE ASSOCIATION. THE PRESIDENT MAY APPOINT SPECIAL COMMITTEES, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.  
SECTION 2. THE COMMITTEE CHAIRPERSON AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS OF EACH COMMITTEE SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT, WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1. THESE BY-LAWS MAY BE AMENDED BY A TWO-THIRDS (2/3) VOTE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS PRESENT AT ANY REGULAR MEETINGS OR SPECIAL MEETING PROVIDED THAT THE AMENDMENT PROPOSED SHALL HAVE BEEN ACTED ON ACCORDING TO THE METHODS SET OUT IN THE CONSTITUTION (AND BY-LAWS) FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION (AND BY-LAWS).
